Who can participate?

Any industry can participate! You can be private citizens, individual businesses, associations, trade groups, worker centers, unions, non-profit organizations, educational institutions, research groups, or others.

How do I participate?

To **participate** in this photo contest, stakeholders can submit up to a **maximum of 5 photos** regarding heat safety in the workplace.

To **submit an entry**, please complete the contest submission form. Learn about eligibility, judging criteria, and more at www.osha.gov/heat/national-heat-contest. Submissions can also be emailed to heatcampaign@dol.gov.

Contest submissions must:

- Promote heat safety in the workplace.
- Be original creations, not copied from OSHA.gov or any other source, and under the submitter's ownership and control.
- Submit web form and be in one of the following formats: weblink, JPG, PNG, Word, PPT.
- Acknowledge contest rules and provide contact information.

Ideas for contest submissions:

OSHA is open to receiving any types of photos showing heat safety in action. Some ideas include:

- Photos of controls being used to protect workers.
- Photos that show workers using shade structures during the workday.
- Photos of training and engagement about heat safety.
- Photos of innovative ways workplaces are cooling workers (i.e., air-conditioned rooms, cooling PPE, etc.).
- Photos of workers utilizing controls.
- Photos of how employers are ensuring cold water access outdoors.
